**TOWN RESTAURANT BRINGS BACK AN ICONIC EXPERIENCE FROM THE 1970S WITH  
“SATAY BY THE RIVER” AT THE FULLERTON HOTEL SINGAPORE**

**From 19 to 29 July 2017, famous local grill masters, Haron Satay, Power Satay, and Sri Geylang Sate will guest stint and showcase their signature satays**



**SINGAPORE, 6 July, 2017** – Reminiscent of the famous Satay Club along The Esplanade, a popular dating hotspot from the 1970s to the mid 1990s, Town Restaurant introduces “Satay By The River” – reviving the experience of enjoying traditional satay along Singapore’s historic port-of-call. From 19 to 29 July 2017, local satay masters from Haron Satay, Power Satay, and Sri Geylang Sate, together with the Fullerton’s team of chefs fuel the nostalgia with a skewered meat grill-off as part of the daily dinner buffet at the restaurant’s recently renovated al fresco patio.

Located within The Fullerton Heritage precinct and steps from the art and culture district, Town Restaurant is a popular choice for pre-theatre and post-exhibition meals. Its stunning view of both “old” and modern Singapore offers a visual feast of Boat Quay’s colourful shophouses juxtaposed against the city’s towering skyscrapers. At sunset, diners may opt to enjoy an ice-cold beer on the al fresco patio as they witness guest chefs from Haron Satay, Power Satay, and Sri Geylang Sate take to the live barbecue, grilling up their unique rendition of one of Singapore’s most beloved dishes.

Family-run Haron Satay’s fame is synonymous with the smoky sweetness of its meats. Hailing from the heart of East Coast Lagoon Food Village, otherwise known as “satay village”, Haron’s is



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well-regarded as a bastion of traditional Malay satay, prepared with a recipe that has been passed down through generations. Power Satay from Lau Pa Sat has garnered its popularity by using only choice cuts of beef tripe and chicken thigh meat. Additionally, the beef tripe is slow-cooked before it hits the grill for a slide-off-the-stick tenderness, well-complemented by their housemade chunky peanut sauce.

Sri Geylang Sate brings to Town Restaurant a waterfront satay experience straight from their pushcart home at Gardens By The Bay. Each skewer is made from three layers of house-marinated chicken, mutton or beef, stacked with a gelatinous cube of fat in the middle which endows a robust flavour over the meat when grilled. Adding to the fan-fire, the Fullerton's team of chefs enrich the repertoire with Japanese-style skewers like Kurobuta Yakiniku Tare, Sous Vide Gyu Tongue with Sea Salt, and Wagyu Beef Kushiyaki, highlighting the universality of enjoying grilled skewered meats.

The daily dinner buffet is also plumped with cold Asian appetisers to pair well with satay. Relish Banana Flower Bud Salad with Prawn and Coconut Cream; and Nyonya Wing Bean Salad with Seafood, Sambal Balacan and Toasted Coconuts from the 12-station spread and save room for fresh ocean spray, Japanese delicacies, a full carvery, Roti Prata, and customise-your-own Chendol and Ice Kachang stations.

The "Satay By The River" experience will continue at Town Restaurant even after 29 July, helmed by the in-house culinary. Dressed in traditional "Baju Kurung"-inspired outfits, the Fullerton chefs will showcase their meat-grilling dexterity daily along the Singapore River promenade whipping up traditional chicken, beef and mutton satay, and dish hearty condiments like Quail Egg Sambal; Sayur Lodeh with "ketupat" or fragrant sticky rice steamed in a woven palm leaf pouch; Nyonya-style Achar; and the quintessential peanut dipping sauce.

Town Restaurant's "**Satay By The River**" Dinner Buffet is available daily from 6.30 p.m. to 10.30 p.m., with three guest chefs stinting from 19 to 29 July 2017.

From Sundays to Tuesdays:

S\$56\* per adult and S\$28\*<sup>^</sup> per child.

From Wednesdays to Saturdays:

Town Restaurant's "**Satay By The River**" will also be served à la carte daily from 5.00 p.m. to 10.30 p.m. Choose from a half dozen mixed satay with a pint of Tiger beer for S\$28\*, or a full dozen skewers with a jug of Tiger beer for S\$58\*. From Sundays to Tuesdays, diners of the daily dinner buffet may opt to enjoy unlimited skewers of satay with a pint of Tiger beer for an additional S\$20\*.
